Art

At the outset of my career I worked with a group of artists in Reading on exhibitions and open studio days, where people could view our work and watch us 'in the process' particularly on community projects such as creating murals. During my Fine Art degree, I was the project assistant to internationally recognised artists, Mark Dion and Robert Williams, as they produced a suite of prints for the 'Art on the Underground' project. Whilst in Kathmandu I worked as a freelance artist for a time in an Animation Studio. I organised exhibitions to showcase my work and did a lot of commission work, mainly screen prints and mixed media painting. My interests currently lie in mixed media printmaking and cyanotype which I have been developing alongside my students.

Travel

I enjoy travelling to areas of cultural and environmental interest. On a round-the-world trip, in 2006 the particular highlights included being an extra in a Bollywood movie in Mumbai, and working for two weeks in the Australian Rainforest. In addition, I worked in South Africa for 2 months, in 2002, on a wildlife conservation project. I have since lived for prolonged periods in Nepal and Thailand, both countries rich in culture and natural beauty which have, in turn, inspired my artwork.

Sports

As an enthusiastic rock-climber I have helped run several rock-climbing clubs in school. I have undertaken several high-altitude treks including to Everest Base Camp and Annapurna Base Camp in Nepal. I greatly enjoy the outdoors.
